BIBLE TEACHINGS

Sacrament of the Altar

Where is this written?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke and St. Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat. This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup after supper, and when he had given thanks, He gave it to them and said, "Drink it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Fourth

Who receives this sacrament worthily?

Fasting and bodily preparation are a fine outward training. But the one who is truly worthy and well prepared is the one who has faith in these words: "Given and poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins." But the one who does not believe these words, or who doubts them, is unworthy and unprepared, because the words "for you" require wholehearted belief.

O Lord Jesus Christ, we thank You, that of Your infinite mercy You have instituted this Your Sacrament, in which we eat Your body and drink Your blood: Grant us, by Your Holy Spirit, that we may not receive this gift unworthily, but that we may confess our sins, remember Your agony and death, believe the forgiveness of sin, and day by day grow in faith and love, until we obtain eternal salvation. Lord, in Your mercy, **Hear our prayer.**
