



BIBLE TEACHINGS

Sacrament of the Altar

Where is this written?

The holy Evangelists Matthew, Mark, Luke and St. Paul write: Our Lord Jesus Christ, on the night when He was betrayed, took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it, and gave it to the disciples and said, "Take, eat. This is my body which is given for you. Do this in remembrance of me." In the same way he took the cup after supper, and when he had given thanks, He gave it to them and said, "Drink it, all of you. This cup is the new covenant in my blood, which is poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins. Do this as often as you drink it, in remembrance of me."

Second

What is the benefit of this eating and drinking?

This is shown by the words: "Given and poured out for you for the forgiveness of sins." In the Sacrament, forgiveness of sins, life, and salvation are given to us through these words. For where there is forgiveness of sins, there is also life and salvation.
