





Third

How can water do such great things?

It is not just the water that does them, but the word of God which is in and with the water, and faith, which trusts this word of God in the water. For without the word of God the water is simply water and no baptism. But with the word of God it is a baptism, that is, a gracious water of life and a washing of regeneration in the Holy Spirit. As St Paul says in Titus, chapter three: "He saved us, through the washing of new birth and renewal by the Holy Spirit, whom God richly poured on us through our Savior Jesus Christ, so that having been justified by his grace, we might become heirs with the certain hope of eternal life. This message is trustworthy" (Titus 3:5-8).
