Red Letter Challenge

We are over halfway through the **Red Letter Challenge**. We are in the middle of spending 40 days with the words of our Savior, "the red letters," as many bibles print them. I hope you have enjoyed digging into the daily devotion and have been blessed to connect in a small group to dive deeper into God's Words and will for us. The five themes guiding the Red Letter Challenge are being, forgiving, serving, giving, going.

Being. Before we do anything meaningful for Jesus, we first have the be with Jesus. In our busy lives we need to carve out time to simply be with our Savior, the Lord of the universe. In his presence we are molded, shaped, formed, and shown His love and mercy.

Forgiving. When we get to know Jesus, we experience his forgiveness. We have a forgiving Savior that gave his very life to show you grace and forgive all your sins. When we learn about Jesus, we see a forgiving God.

Serving. Jesus is a servant and calls us to serve others. When God came near, he could have come with a big show and demanded people to honor and serve him, but rather God became a servant and served us. As followers of Jesus, we serve others.

Giving. Trusting in Jesus makes us generous. When we know how much God has generously done for us, He opens up our hearts, hands, and resources to be generous to others. Christians give to God's work, give to other people, give to community causes. They give their time, their service, their skills, their money, their prayers. Christians should be known as the most generous people on earth because we have an eternally generous God.

Going. The Gospel is for you, but not *just* for you. When you know what Jesus has done for you, you tell others in word and deed. As disciples of Jesus, we are sent by him to our neighbors, coworkers, friends, and families to shine the light of Christ and them that He died and rose for them too.
